## **The theme: 'The people, ideas, and technologies that are changing development forever'**

The future of international development is changing. From the increasing importance of new technologies in development initiatives to the revolutionary approaches of grassroots movements from Ethiopia to Brazil, new ideas and innovations are irreversibly changing the way people change the world. Over the weekend we will be bringing together top researchers, writers, thinkers, and campaigners to discuss these changes and the impact they are having across the globe.

We'll also be providing a full day of practical advocacy training on the 11<sup>th</sup> for everyone from first time campaigners to seasoned professionals, and organising a full day of face-to-face advocacy meetings with key development professionals from across the public and private sectors.

## **The sessions on Saturday**

**'Doing it for themselves: national and grassroots development successes that are breaking the mould'** Hear from world-leading organisations taking novel, dynamic approaches to changing the world.

**'Technology and development: today and tomorrow'**. In this session we'll consider the changes that new technology is bringing to the way we development, and look ahead at where that progress will take us.

**'Delivering education in an ever-changing world'**. With 57 million children out-of-school around the world, governments and civil society are having to innovate every day to meet changing challenges. Join our panel of experts to hear about the cutting edge work going on around the world on getting kids into school.

**'The unseen hand of progress? Does the private sector hold the key to development in the 21st Century?'** In this contested debate we'll be asking our panel to discuss one of the biggest changes the world of development has seen in recent memory: the rapidly growing involvement of private actors in development programming.

**Final session and Keynote: 'Is zero possible? Fulfilling the World Bank's ambition of ending poverty by 2013'** Ideas don't come much bigger than Jim-Kim's plan to end extreme poverty by 2030. Laying out how they plan on achieving that goal will be a top-level UK representative from the Bank.
